I love him very much.



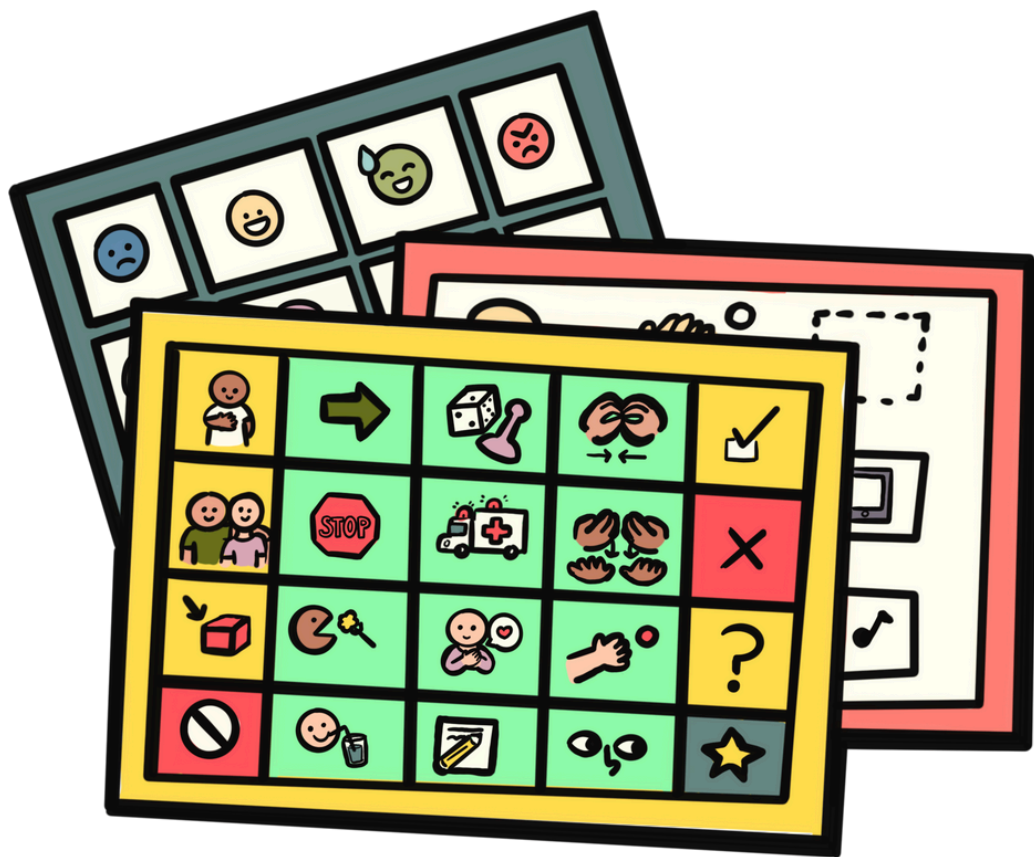
My brother is autistic.
