I love her very much.



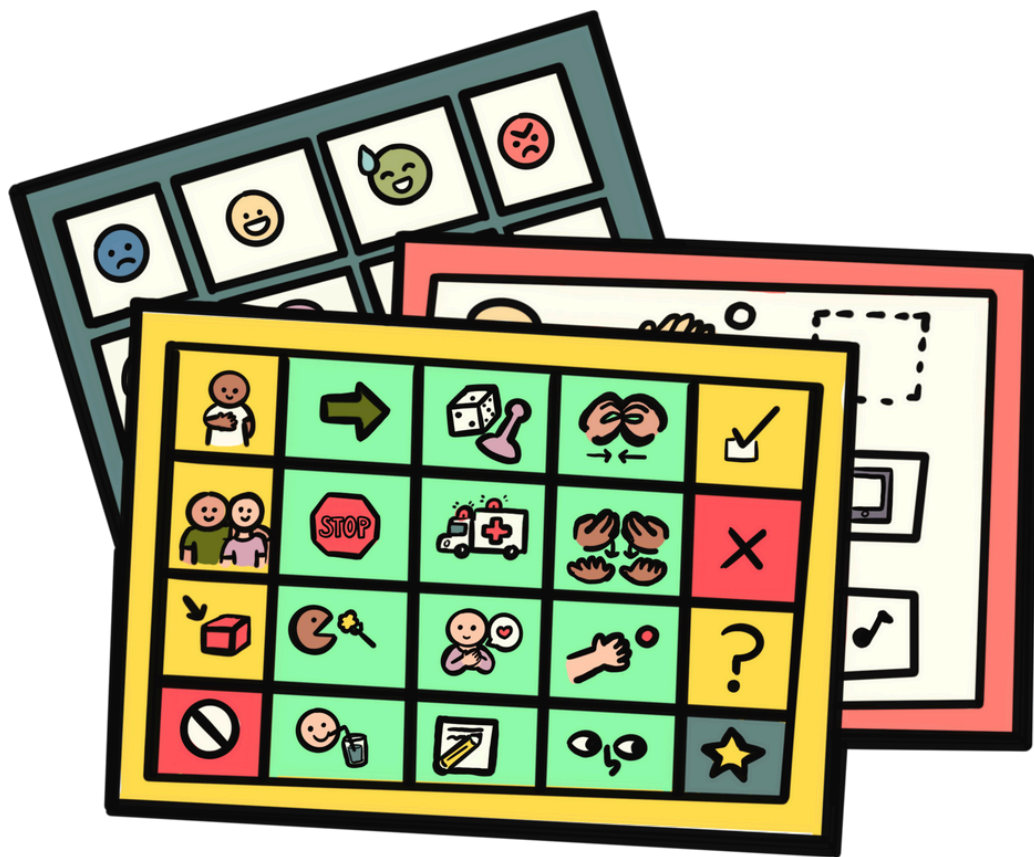
My sister is autistic.
